As a result, television, movies, and photography have become important links that connect students to the natural world. In that regard, the **Sutton Avian Research Center**, an internationally renowned ornithological research and conservation organization based near Bartlesville, Oklahoma, is offering its annual scholarship competition for the Sutton Award. This award recognizes those students who demonstrate the ability to communicate current conservation topics in compelling ways.


## Eligibility.


- 1. Student must be in tenth, eleventh, or twelfth grade.

- 3. Student must not be an employee or an immediate family member of an employee of the Sutton Center.


